

# 2025 Federal Election Scorecard

## Planning for future food security



Committed to a National Food Security Plan.



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No commitment to a National Food Security Plan.

## Reducing the cost of farming



Maintaining support for super tax. Commitment to consider right to repair. 12 month extension of the \$20,000 Instant Asset Write Off. Silent on Regional Investment Corporation.



Will scrap the super tax. Will increase and make permanent a \$30,000 Instant Asset Write Off, introduce an import container levy, and consider right to repair.



Supports a more damaging super tax. Silent on right to repair and container levy. 12mth extension of the \$20,000 Instant Asset Write Off. Will adversely alter Fuel Tax Credits.

## Partnering for sustainability



Will continue water buybacks and Scope 3 climate reporting for agriculture. Modest new funding for feral pest control and commitment to a biofuels feedstock strategy.



Will end water buybacks and Scope 3 reporting for agriculture. No additional funding for feral pest control or market led solutions for nature.



Supports water buybacks & ending native forest logging. Will establish \$250m 'Green Agriculture Australia'. Committed 1% of the Federal budget for nature, but needs better targeting.

## A productive & safe workforce



No plans to improve industrial relations or visa settings, with a risk of adverse changes. Supports \$2.5m for FarmSafe Australia.



Plans to rebalance some industrial relations laws and the PALM Scheme, maintain Working Holiday Makers, & introduce an Ag Visa. \$2.5m for FarmSafe Australia.



Adverse plans to change industrial relations and visa settings. Significant funding commitment for mental health (not agriculture-specific).

## Fair & competitive access to markets



Remain committed to banning live sheep exports, but says it will maintain live cattle exports. Announced a \$1bn+ support package following US trade disruptions.



Committed to repeal the live sheep export ban, and supports live cattle exports. Supports Labor's \$1bn+ support package announcements, with differences in the delivery approach.



Supports the banning of all live animal exports. No clear policies to support agricultural market access.

## Infrastructure and services for the regions



Falls short on regional infrastructure. Further \$20m for the On Farm Connectivity Program. \$1bn to address childcare deserts.



Falls short on regional infrastructure, but committed to using the dividends of a \$20bn Regional Australia Future Fund to contribute to regional funding priorities.



Silent on road funding and regional infrastructure. \$3bn communications fund to support regional connectivity. \$10bn+ in funding for childcare and early education.

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
